We have received a number of complaints that staff have been witnessed transferring patients in unsafe ways that could both cause injury to the staff and also the patient being transferred.

Can I remind staff that:

Top and Tail - Through-arm, or hammock, have been proven to be a major cause of patient injuries to both joints and soft tissue. This also puts extra strain on crew member(s) back.

I. Individual



L. Load



E. Environment



E. Equipment

The Draglift - This includes any way of handling the patient in which the handler places a hand or an arm under the patient's armpit (axilla), this has been proven to be a major cause of patient injuries to both joints and soft tissue. This also puts extra strain on crew member(s) back.





Bear Hug – This method puts all the patients' weight on the crew member's neck – also a creating bend back posture.

- Patient weight is too much and is also unpredictable
- Staff are at risk of injury in all unsafe manual handling techniques
- Manual lifts are not therapeutic; they do not improve the patient's mobility.

There are a number of 'traditional' techniques which are now considered unsafe and which must no longer be used.
